MUSEUM OF FLIGHT TOUR

THURSDAY, AUGUST 22, 2019

At 8:30 am you will board your motor coach at the Hilton Bellevue for a 9:00 am departure. You will be duly impressed when you arrive at the Museum of Flight at Boeing Field. There will be planes on the tarmac as a teaser of what is inside. You may join a guided tour which lasts about one hour which leads visitors through the evolution of aviation by examining the aircraft in the Museum's world class collection, including the famous Blackbird, the only remaining Boeing 80A and Aerocar III. Or you are free to scope out and follow your interests. You won't want to miss the 'Red Barn', Bill Boeing's original aircraft plant from the beginning of the Boeing Company in 1916. Boeing is another Corporation with beginnings in Seattle. It was barged to Museum from its original location. Even though The Boeing Company moved its headquarters to Chicago in 2001, they still have a major presence in WA with manufacturing plants in Renton and Everett. Lunch will be ready for you between 11:30 and 1:30 pm in the beautiful Skyview Room (on the 2nd floor) overlooking the runways.

On a nice day you may enjoy your lunch on their outside deck. Then back on your motor coach by 2:00 pm for the departure at 2:30 pm for a return to the Hilton Bellevue at approximately 3:00 pm.

PIKE PLACE MARKET TOUR

FRIDAY, AUGUST 23, 2019

You will be picked up in front of the Hilton Bellevue at 8:30 am for a 9:00 am departure and transported by motor coach to The Pike Place Market in downtown Seattle. This is a public market overlooking the Elliot Bay waterfront in Seattle. The Market opened August 17, 1907, and is one of the oldest continuously operated public farmers' markets in the United States. It is a place of business for many small farmers, craftspeople and merchants. Named after the central street, Pike Place, with more than 10 million visitors annually, Pike Place Market is Seattle's most popular tourist destination and the 33rd most visited tourist attraction in the world. Some of the special attractions are: The first Starbucks Coffee store, founded in 1971, it has been in continuous operation in its present location since 1977. There you go, another Corporate Headquarters in Seattle. The sign outside this branch, unlike others, features the original logo a bare-breasted siren that was modeled after a 15-century Norse woodcut. The Pike Place Fish Market, where employees throw 3-foot salmon and other fish to each other rather than passing by hand is a famous stall. After your visit and lunch on your own at one or two of the eateries you will re-enter your motor coach and returned to the Hilton Bellevue. You must be at the designated pick up spot by 1:30 pm, because the buses are not allowed to set and wait for passengers the buses will leave at 2:00 pm and will arrive back at the Hilton Bellevue at approximately 3:00 pm.

MOUNT RAINIER

We would like for you to consider a tour on your way to or from the NWRG around Mt. Rainier. Mt. Rainier is the tallest mountain in WA State at 14,411 feet. If you are coming from the South via I-5 you would take exit #68 east on Hwy 12 towards Mt. Rainier and Morton to Hwy 123 north. If you are leaving from the North, you would take Hwy 169 to Enumclaw to Hwy 410 east to Hwy 123 south. Either way you won't want to miss the Grove of the Patriarchs inside the Mt. Rainier National Park. You will need your Golden Age/America the Beautiful Pass for entry to the park otherwise it is a \$25 fee per car for a 1-7 day pass. Here are some suggestions for overnight stays, as follows:
